

Mandatory Language for Monitoring and Reporting Violation

Failure to Submit a Disinfectant Level Quarterly Operating Report (DLQOR) MONITORING, ROUTINE (DBP), MAJOR/CHLORINE

The **City of Leonard** water system PWS ID **0740005** has violated the monitoring and reporting requirements set by Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) in Title 30, Texas Administrative Code (30 TAC), Section 290, Subchapter F. Public water systems are required to properly disinfect water before distribution, maintain acceptable disinfection residuals within the distribution system, monitor the disinfectant residual at various locations throughout the distribution system, and report the results of that monitoring to the TCEQ on a quarterly basis.

Results of regular monitoring are an indicator of whether or not your drinking water is safe from microbial contamination.

This/These reporting violation(s) occurred for the monitoring period(s) 07/01/2015 through 09/3-/2015 and 10/01/2015 through 12/31/2015

We are taking the following actions to address this issue:

Reports were completed but not submitted to the TCEQ on the proper deadlines. Special calendar notations have been made for future reports to be filed on or before the deadline on a quarterly basis.
